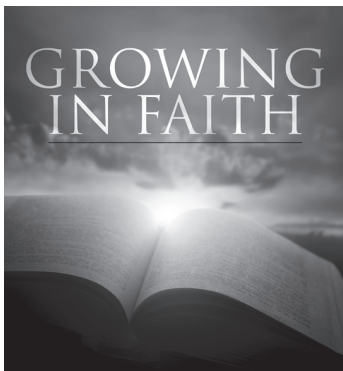
Random Acts of Kindness Day
