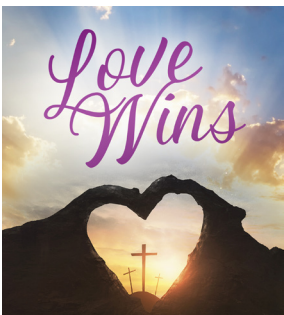

CHURCH MEETING AND DISAFFILIATION VOTE TODAY

- *Lunch:* A build-your-own box lunch is available for free at both campuses. Edmond Campus: Pick up your lunch in the Youth Room from 11:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. Downtown Campus: Pick up your lunch in the Fellowship Hall from 11 a.m. – 1 p.m. You may eat in the designated Sunday School classrooms.
- *Childcare:* Childcare is available starting at 1 p.m. Nursery care for children from birth through age 3 is available in Room 116, first floor on the southwest side of the building. PreK – 6th grade may check in on the 2nd floor outside of Room 210.
- *Member Voter Registration:* St. Luke's Members will need to register with a photo ID to verify your membership prior to the meeting start time. Registration will take place in the Christian Life Center (CLC) at the Downtown Campus starting at 12 noon.
- *Registered Voter Areas:* The meeting takes place in the Sanctuary and the doors to the Sanctuary will open at 12:30 p.m. Only Registered Voters will be allowed to enter. If the Sanctuary's first floor and balcony fill up, Registered Voters will be allowed to watch the meeting and vote from the Christian Life Center. If the Christian Life Center fills up, Registered Voters will be allowed to watch the meeting and vote from the Fellowship Hall. There will only be microphones in the Sanctuary for those who wish to speak in favor or against the motion during the discussion.
- A vote "Yes" is a vote to Disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church Denomination. A vote "No" is a vote to stay in the United Methodist denomination. An "Abstain" will be counted as a "No" vote. If a ballot is invalid or not returned, it will also be counted as a "No" vote.
- The ballots will be collected, counted, and the result will be announced during the meeting. For the motion to pass, the "Yes" vote needs to be 66.7% or above of all ballots distributed.

EASTER SUNDAY

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Come celebrate the joy of Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday, April 9, at both St. Luke's campuses. The Edmond Campus will hold a LifeLight service on Saturday, April 8, at 5 p.m. in the Worship Center, and three services on Easter Sunday: a Sunrise service at 6:30 a.m., a LifeLight service at 9 a.m., and a Traditional service at 11 a.m. The Downtown Campus will have Traditional worship services at 8:15 and 10:50 a.m. in the Sanctuary, and a LifeLight contemporary service at 9:30 a.m. in the Christian Life Center (CLC).

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

MAUNDY THURSDAY SERVICE OF HOLY COMMUNION

Join your family of faith for the Maundy Thursday Service of Holy Communion on April 6 at 6 p.m. and at 6:30 p.m. at the Downtown Campus. Maundy Thursday is the first of the three days of solemn remembrance of the events leading up to and immediately following the crucifixion of Jesus. On this night, Christians commemorate the Last Supper Jesus shared with his disciples when Jesus washed the disciples' feet and instituted the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Good Friday reaffirms our focus on Jesus as Christ through His crucifixion, and prepares us for His resurrection on Easter Sunday morning.
